- Xiao Bao everything on the menu is phenomenal. Get one of each, share with the table, and if there are leftovers, take home and enjoy for breakfast the next day.
- Husk a go-to recommendation when friends visit from out of town. Husk serves
  creative, southern dishes that change daily based on seasonal availability of
  ingredients.
- Lou Parisian-inspired seasonal dishes, fresh ingredients, and great ambiance.
- <u>The Pharmacy</u> burgers with a big outdoor garden dining area... a wonderful way to enjoy good weather
- <u>Sixty Vines</u> good food, and is conveniently located at the top of the 5th and Broad complex in the heart of downtown
- <u>Butcher & Bee</u> Southern meets Mediterranean and it is delicious. The whipped feta appetizer is a must.
- <u>Pinewood Social</u> has good food, but perhaps more importantly, is located near downtown and has a free parking garage that is validated through the restaurant.
- <u>Barcelona Wine Bar</u> a Spanish inspired menu of tapas that are meant to be shared with the table. Nashville insider tip: The unmarked speakeasy, <u>Old Glory</u> sits behind Barcelona Wine Bar and hosts a live jazz band on Monday nights.
- <u>Bourbon Steak</u> definitely a splurge, but it is continually ranked as the best steakhouse in Nashville for a reason. Located at the top of the Marriott Hotel, Bourbon has some of the best views of Music City
- <u>Culture & Co.</u> a charcuterie conveyor belt that is affordably priced, need I say more?
- Yeast Bakery get the jalapeno cheddar kolache
- <u>Five Daughters Bakery</u> the 100-layer donuts are delicious for breakfast and/or dessert

#### Helpful Tips:

- Restaurants in Nashville book-up fast. For best luck, I recommend making reservations at least two weeks in advance
- Parking is very limited in Nashville and is often expensive... when going out to dinner, don't assume that the restaurant will have free parking nearby. If you are going to be in downtown, I recommend parking in the <u>Music City Center Garage</u>

and then walking to your destination. If you are staying within a 10-15 minute drive of your destination, I would recommend utilizing Uber - it will likely be around the same price as a parking garage, but without the hassle of navigation.
